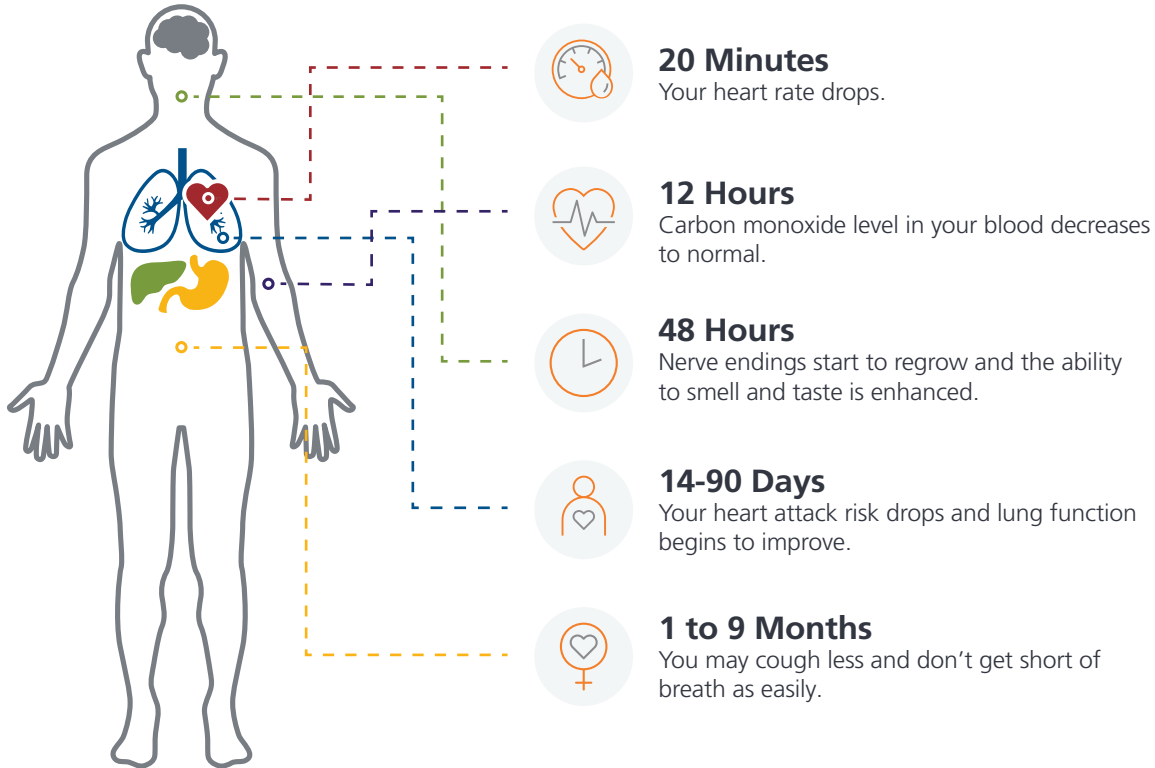


THE POSITIVE EFFECTS OF QUITTING TOBACCO

1 YEAR

The excess risk of coronary heart disease is half that of a continuing smoker.

2 to 5 YEARS

Your risk of having a stroke is the same as a nonsmoker.

15 YEARS
